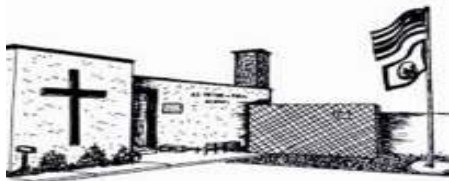
Greetings from the Art Room!

Spring is definitely in the air. Kindergarten through 8th grade had Terra Nova testing last week & Spring Fever is running rampant in the halls, affecting both teachers & students!

Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd grades have just completed their Spring-themed Windssocks and the Art Room is festive with these decorations hanging from the ceiling. The younger grades have been learning their colors/order of the rainbow, their primary colors & how to mix the secondary colors. These Art classes are always excited & energetic, and the students joyfully immerse themselves in our projects.
