Reflections for the Third Sunday of Easter

This is frequently mentioned as St. John's the Evangelist ultimate proof for how a person knew he or she is a believer - as St. John states:

“Those who say ‘I know Him,’ but do not keep His commandments - are liars,
and the truth is no in him.”

A believer in Jesus lives like Jesus. True Christians grow to act more and more like Christ. Those who don't demonstrate a Christ-like lifestyle are - at minimum - failing to provide evidence of their salvation.

Anyone who claims to be “in Christ” but fails to live like Christ certainly does not have a fellowship or relationship with Him. St. John the Evangelist calls them liars!!

Our Catholic Faith:

in the Resurrection of the Lord

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that the Resurrection of Jesus Christ was a real and historical event. “The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a REAL EVENT - with manifestations that were historically verified, the New Testament bears witness.” (CCC639)

Clearly, there are aspects of our Lord's Resurrection which transcends the limitations of time and space - still the event itself was witnessed in history and dramatically changed the lives of those who witnessed it.

Peter, speaking on the day of Pentecost says, “God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses.” (Acts 2: 32)
