*Reflection:      Entering Ordinary Time Cycle C*

Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a particular element of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sunday, these weeks are devoted to the mystery of Christ in its entirety. This period is known as Ordinary Time.

Ordinary Time, this year of 2022, begins on January 10 Monday ~ after the Baptism of Our Lord and continues until Tuesday before Ash Wednesday inclusive. (March 2nd - Ash Wednesday) It begins again on the Monday after Pentecost and ends before in the Eve of the first Sunday of Advent.

The celebration of the liturgical year possesses a distinct sacramental force and efficiency because Christ Himself in His mysteries and in the memorials of His Saints, especially of His Mother, continues His mission of infinite mercy. Therefore, His faithful people not only recall and contemplate the mysteries of redemption but also lay hold of them, enter into communion with them, and live by them.

Therefore, what happens in our Churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday, like all sacraments is simultaneously “a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom” (St. John Paul II). This is not ordinary at all ! This is the fabric of Christian living.



*Our Catholic Faith ~ Catholic Teaching on the 1st Miracle of Jesus  
(The Wedding Feast at Cana)*

As a result of Mary’s powerful intercession, Jesus performs His first public miracle at the Wedding Feast of Cana. Thereby preventing a very embarrassing situation on the wedding day of this young couple.

The Apostles witnessed this and their faith in Jesus grew. Let us beg for the grace to know Jesus, love Him, and follow Him all the more closely through the presence and intercession of Mary, the Mother of God and our own Mother.

*(A) MARY LEADS US TO JESUS:*

There was never anyone on earth as close to Jesus as Mary. Therefore, if I want to get closer to Jesus, to know and love Him more ardently, I should turn to Mary.

*(B) MARY OBTAINS JOY FOR US:*

Mary wants us all to be joyful as in the wedding feast at Cana. True joy comes from sharing our lives with Jesus and Mary.

*(C) MARY HELPS US SOLVE OUR PROBLEMS:*

It was through Mary’s intercession (“they have no more wine”) that the problem was resolved - quickly. She immediately turned to her son Jesus. Mary can help us - she earnestly desires to help us. Talk to Our Lady - Our Mother !
