\* Reflection:      *for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ Cycle C* \*

\* *The first Preaching Mission of Jesus Christ ~ Jesus' Inaugural Speech* \*

\* After the Baptism of Jesus, then His first miracle in Cana - Jesus begins His public ministry in a synagogue, declaring His direction of His ministry of Love for the salvation of all. \*

\* As Jesus stands in the synagogue, He reads from the scroll handed to Him; it contains the words of the prophet Isaiah. As this early moment in His ministry, Jesus announces His mission in continuity with Israel's prophetic tradition. This reading from Isaiah defines Jesus' ministry; which will include bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to the captives, healing to the sick, freedom to the oppressed, and proclaiming a year acceptable to the Lord. \*

\* Today, Jesus presents His mission, and by using the words of Isaiah as the basis of His mission, Christ announced His reign of peace, justice, freedom, and love to all those suffering from all kinds of oppression and injustice. \*

\* Like Nehemiah in our first reading, Jesus proclaims the good news of the new era to all of us. \*



\* Our Catholic Faith ~ Jesus as our Teacher and Savior \*



\* ~ 1 ~ Why was Jesus called a Teacher (CC 427) \*

\* The Jesus of history was both a healer and teacher. He gathered around Him twelve Apostles and carefully instructed them so they could carry His work and preach His message. In addition, he travelled throughout the Holy Land preaching to the people in the fields, in the marketplace, seashores, and synagogues. \*

\* ~ 2 ~ What characterized Jesus' teaching style (CC 546) \*

\* Jesus' teaching style was imaginative and provoked much interest. His whole life, every action and word He spoke - WAS His teaching. People took notice when He healed lepers or associated with sinners - they listened when He boldly scolded the hypocrites. The people were delighted with His parables, short stories, and surprising endings. His teachings caused people to ponder His message - and people changed their lifestyles because of His teachings. \*

\* ~ 3 ~ Why was Jesus' teachings important (CC 561) \*

\* Because He conveyed very important messages of God's love for all of us; His life, His preaching, His miracles, His loving acceptance of people; His prayer life - and His death for our salvation. His words are life giving - they show us the way to true happiness and unlocks the meaning of life. \*
