SSPP School has an excellent children's library including a children's science library. The science library has over 400 books and is the largest & most comprehensive children's science library in the area. The library uses the AR (Accelerated Readers) system to determine children's grade reading level. Children are encouraged to read at their level or above. Many children read above their grade level. All books have been donated or purchased with donations. Books are borrowed for two weeks and may be re-newed.

The most popular books of the younger children are the Dr. Seuss and Disney collections, Magic Treehouse and Fancy Nancy. They also enjoy Mrs. Harp reading to them.

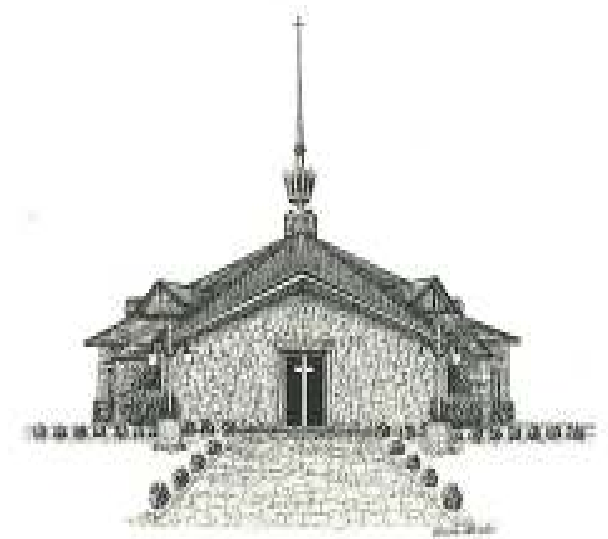
Popular among the older children are The Dork Diaries, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, Who was ?, Goosebumps, Star Wars, Great Illustrated Classics, Harry Potter Series, science books and horse books. Also popular are books by current authors such as Rick Riordan, Margaret Haddix and Suzanne Collins.

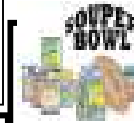
