Stop by the school office to purchase your chances for the Lowe's \$500 gift card raffle. \$10 per ticket and only 250 tickets will be sold.

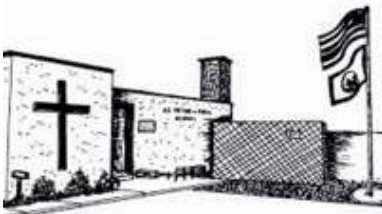
This year's open house is scheduled for Tuesday, March 13th at 6pm, followed by PTO at 7pm.

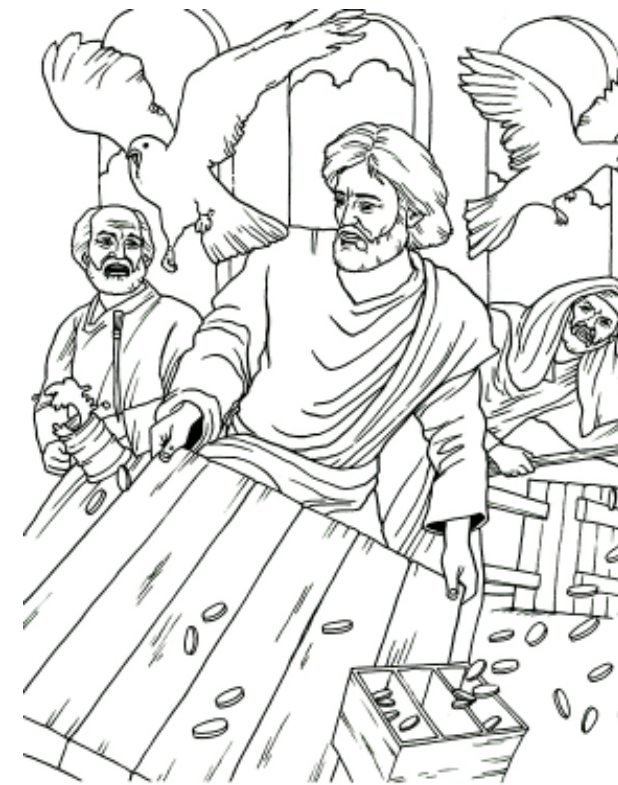
