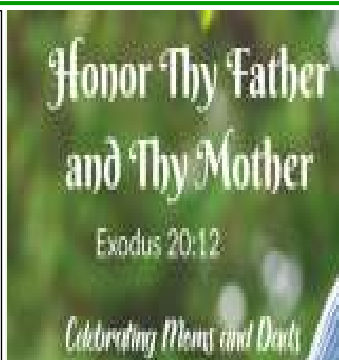

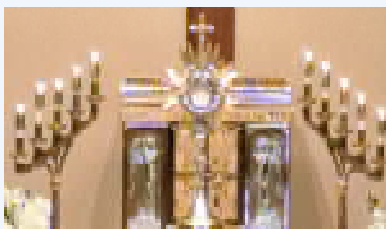


Consecrating the U.S.A. to the Sacred Heart on June 12

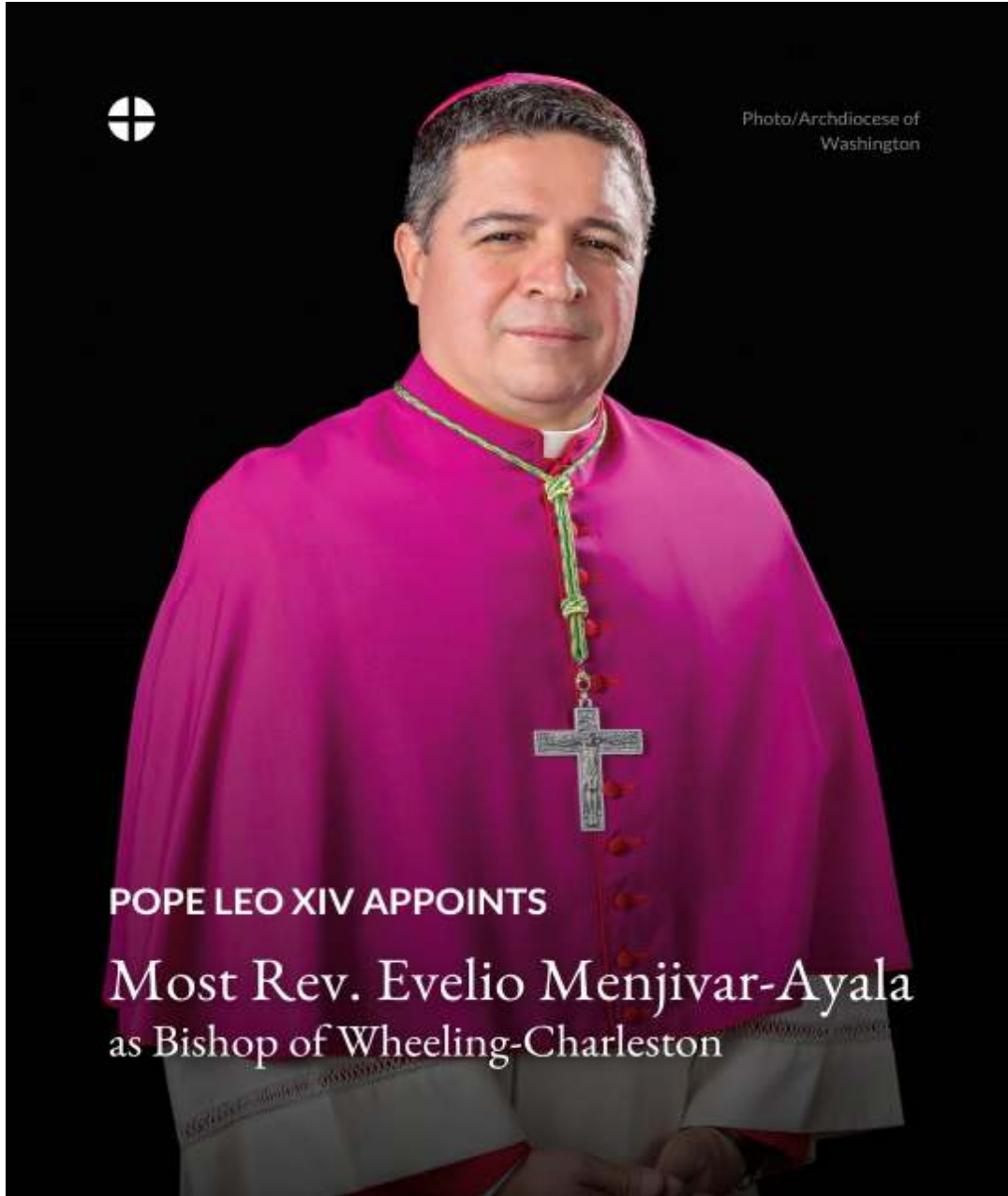


Guild for the Cause of Father Carroll

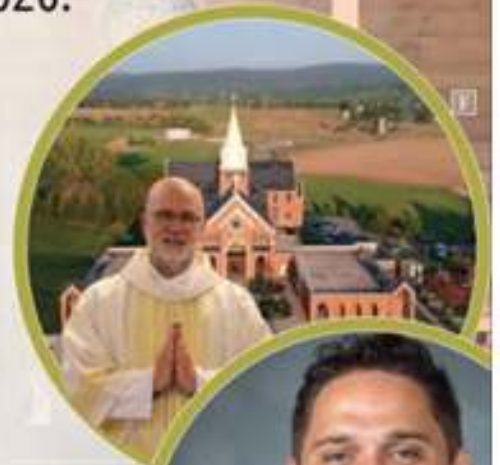
