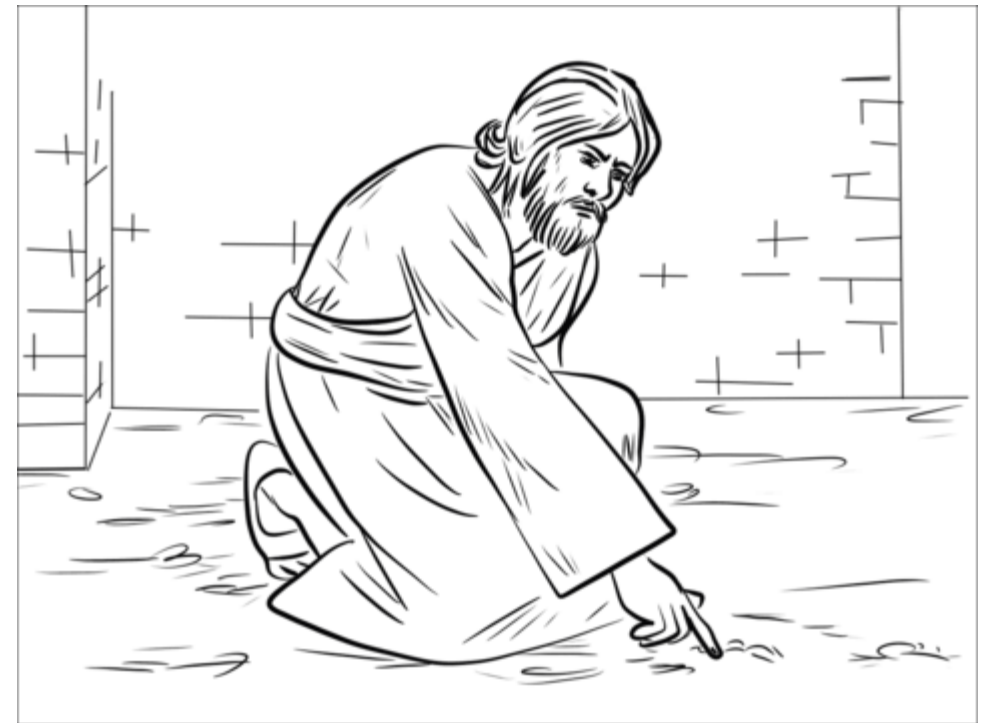

Fr Higgs Leads Pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy

Fr. Donald Higgs, Rector at the Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Charleston, WV, will be the Spiritual Director for a 12-Day Pilgrimage to the Shines of Italy from October 7-18, 2019. The Itinerary includes 2 night in Venice, 2 nights *each* in Florence and Assisi, and 3 nights in Rome. Side trips to Milan, Siena, and Padua are planned. The cost is \$4300 each. Deposit is \$450 each with final payment by July 7, 2019. An Early Booking Discount is available. The package includes air from most East coast and Midwest cities, daily breakfast and dinners, Superior Tourist Class hotels, and English speaking guides.
