Matthew 25: 14 - 30

"Out of Fear" Three servants, each were given money to invest. Two were very successful - one was not. Why? This particular servant received one talent, buries it at earned his master's displeasure. The Gospel says he did so - out of fear! Two servants overcame their fear; one was controlled by fear! Why?....

"There are no Ungifted People" But there are people who do not use their gifts - or - use them for bad purpose. There is no person here at Sts.
