

ASH WEDNESDAY AND BEYOND

As we approach Ash Wednesday let's focus on what we get to do, because we love God.

Lent is a time to be a doer – giving and giving up. From Ash Wednesday on, we are to pray, fast, and give alms as an act of penance, because we love God. All of these sacrifices and mortifications of the faithful are not in vain. Remember what St. Paul said in a letter to the Romans (5:3-4): sufferings produce endurance; endurance produces character; and character produces hope.

PRAYER: Give yourself time to commit to prayer. Pray wholeheartedly not only for our own needs, but also give up time to pray for the needs of others. Come to the Eucharist and to the Blessed Sacrament. Commit one hour every week this season for Adoration. Check the bulletin for Adoration times.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE: Give yourself a mind-set refresh and be confident and fearless in your fasting with the ultimate purpose – preparation for eternity. Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday – taking only one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal. The sick and expectant mothers are excused from fasting. Catholics from age 18 to 59 are requested to fast.

Abstinence on every Friday's of Lent. Abstinence is refraining from eating meat and is mandatory for everyone older than 14 years. Give up listening to the many negative voices and our own doubts and anxiety. Fast from meat, yes, but fast too from being judgmental, selfish, and too busy.

ALMSGIVING: Give in love. Prayerfully consider where God is guiding you to give up your treasure to help another. Be mindful of the needs in your community, parish, and parish school. In our parish we have GIVE LOVE ~ LIVE LOVE which is seeking to raise funds to repair the roof of our parish school.



MOUNT2000 Youth Retreat Mount St. Mary's University







WV Faithful to be Part of the Revival

Will you be one of the 250 people to represent the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston at the National Eucharistic Revival in Indianapolis this summer?


